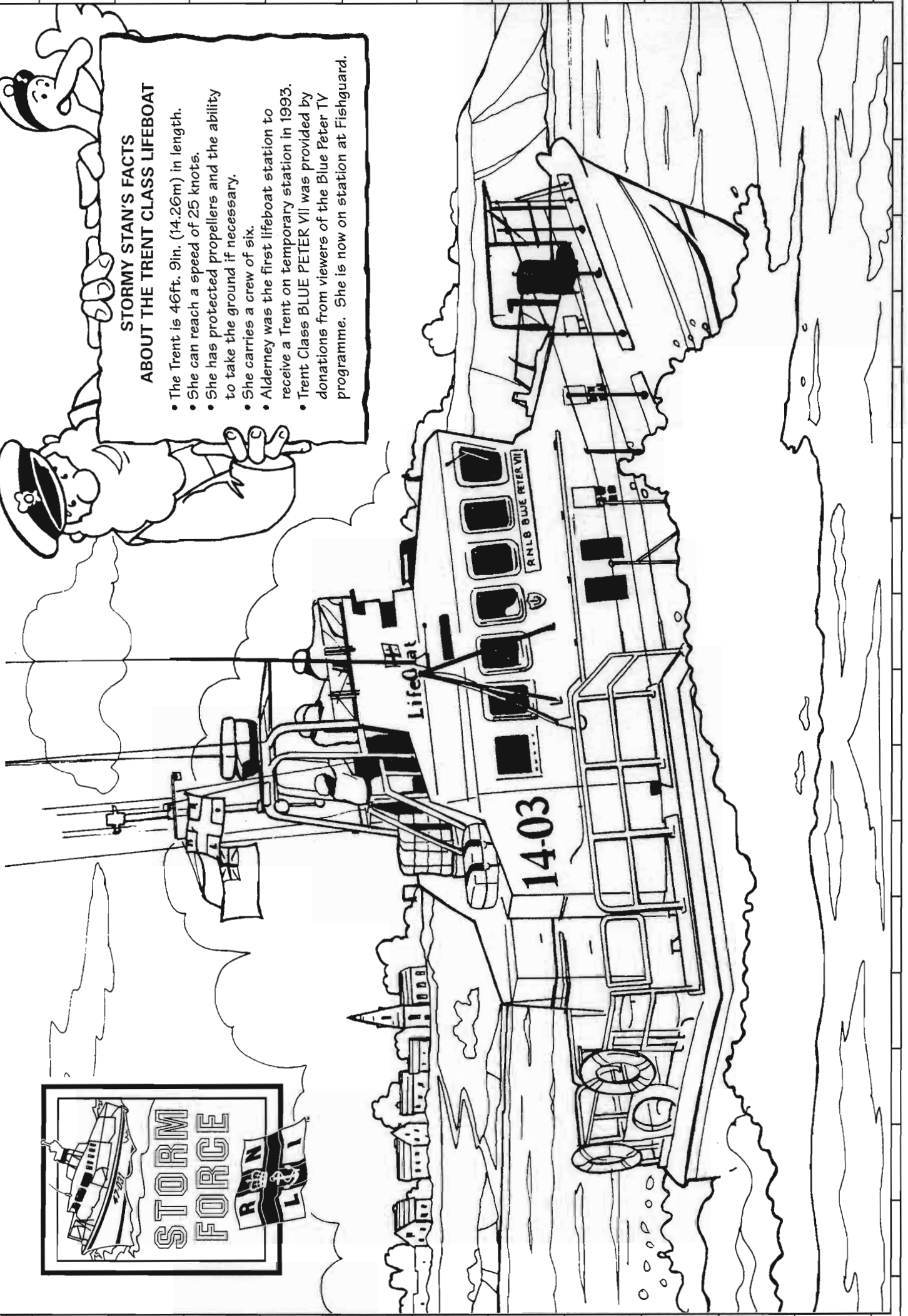
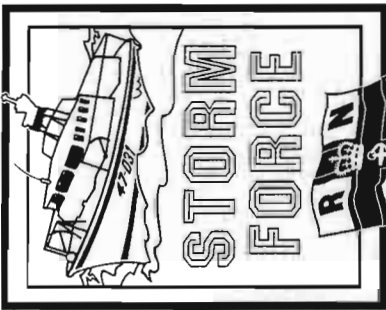

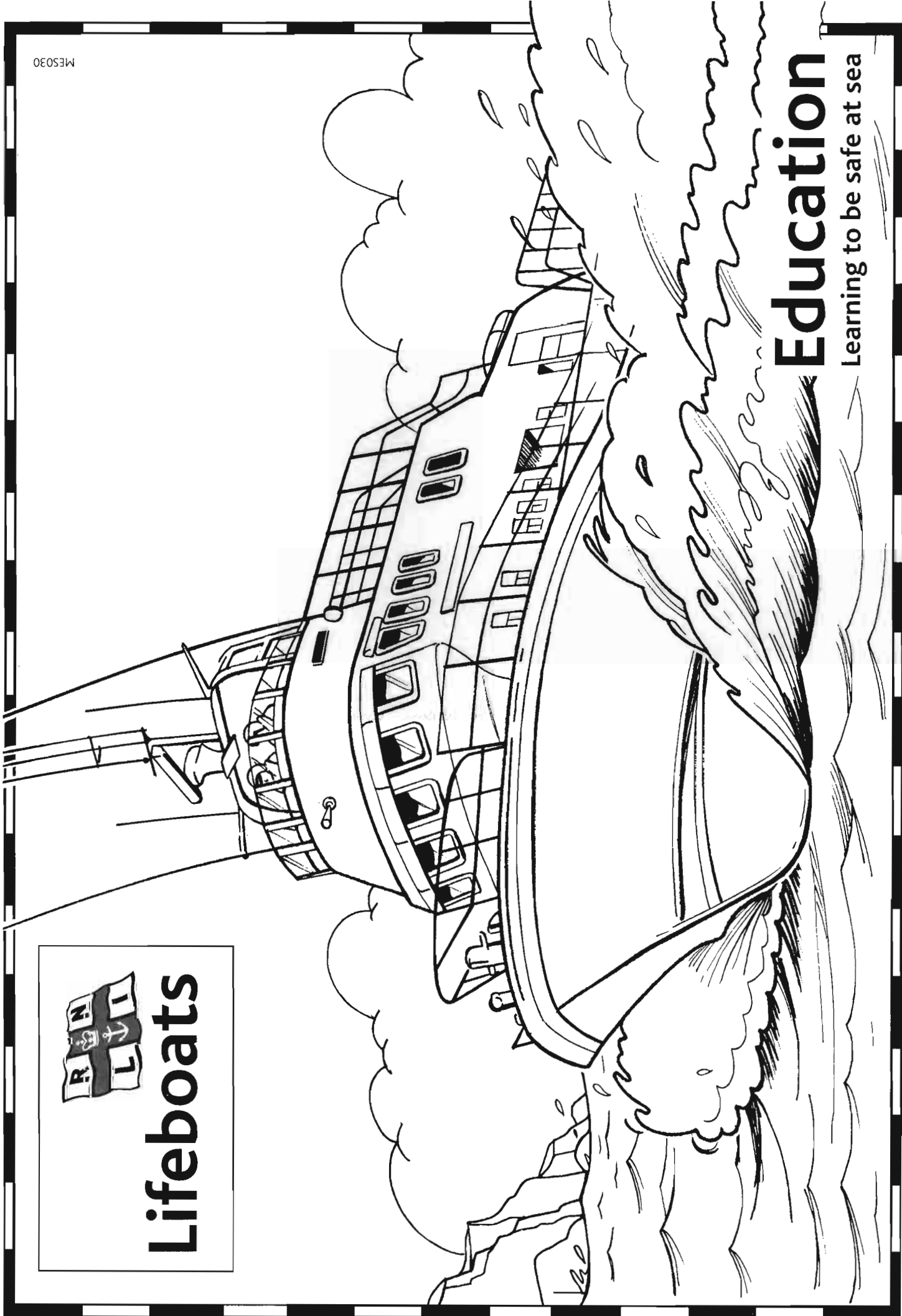

STORMY STAN'S FACTS ABOUT THE TRENT CLASS LIFEBOAT

- The Trent is 46ft. 9in. (14.26m) in length.
- She can reach a speed of 25 knots.
- She has protected propellers and the ability to take the ground if necessary.
- She carries a crew of six.
- Alderney was the first lifeboat station to receive a Trent on temporary station in 1993.
- Trent Class BLUE PETER VII was provided by donations from viewers of the Blue Peter TV programme. She is now on station at Fishguard.
